c. Expected Results

- 1. Organisational gender needs assessment results
- 2. Customised gender mainstreaming training approach
- 3. Deliver two-day gender mainstreaming workshop to key CHAK staff (approximately 20 staff)
- 4. Action/Follow up plan to ensure gender mainstreaming in CHAK's strategic plan, programmes and projects
- 5. Gender mainstreaming evaluation framework
