Dear Leader Schumer and Leader McConnell,

The 35 undersigned organizations are implementers, advocates, and supporters of U.S. global health programs. As faith-based organizations, we are called to tend to the sick, the poor and the hungry. We write to urge you in a united and unshakable voice to pass a clean, five-year reauthorization for the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR) before its expiration on September 30.

PEPFAR has had the broad support of Congress since it was created in 2003 by President George W. Bush (*with such margins as an 80-16 vote in the Senate and 375-41 in the House*). Since that time, PEPFAR has saved the lives of over 25 million people, provided treatment for 20.1 million people, prevented mother-to-child transmission for 5.5 million babies, and provided care to 7 million orphans and vulnerable children. This <u>success</u> has fueled PEPFAR reauthorization three times.

Today, we are very close to achieving the goal of an AIDS-free generation. This is the worst time to see this flagship program in danger of not being reauthorized, and jeopardizing the results and investments made over these last 20 years.

PEPFAR serves as a flagship initiative demonstrating the impact and leadership of the United States around the world. As an interagency program, PEPFAR has achieved remarkable success, partnering with global and local organizations, many of which are faith-based. The faith community has been integral to PEPFAR's success, and PEPFAR's support has been instrumental in providing resources and technical assistance that enable faith-based organizations to serve those in most need. Among these are the vibrant network of high capacity Christian Health Associations and many small independent organizations and facilities, who meet the needs of millions of people.

As champions for PEPFAR, we thank you for your past support of this life-saving, bipartisan program and ask for your leadership in ensuring it continues its work through a clean, five-year reauthorization.
