47% of learners had never received prior mental health training

45% of learners had never previously taken an online course

86% had already applied knowledge gained in their personal or professional life

98% felt the training had a positive impact on their professional life, including an increased knowledge of mental health, improved ability to support others, feeling better equipped to share about their own mental health needs or feeling encouraged to seek support for their own well being.

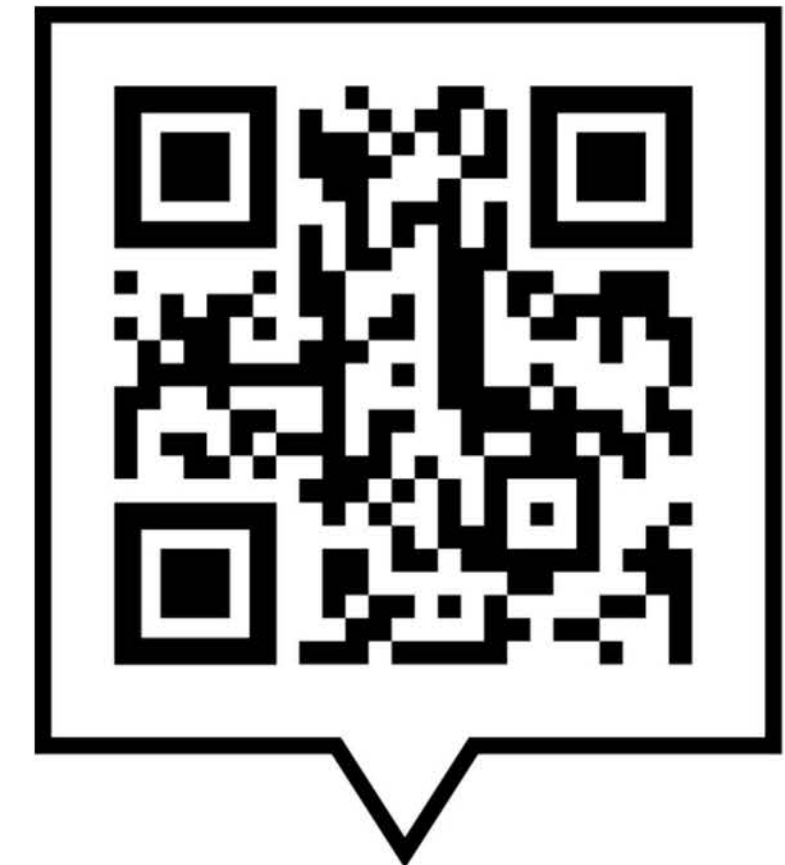
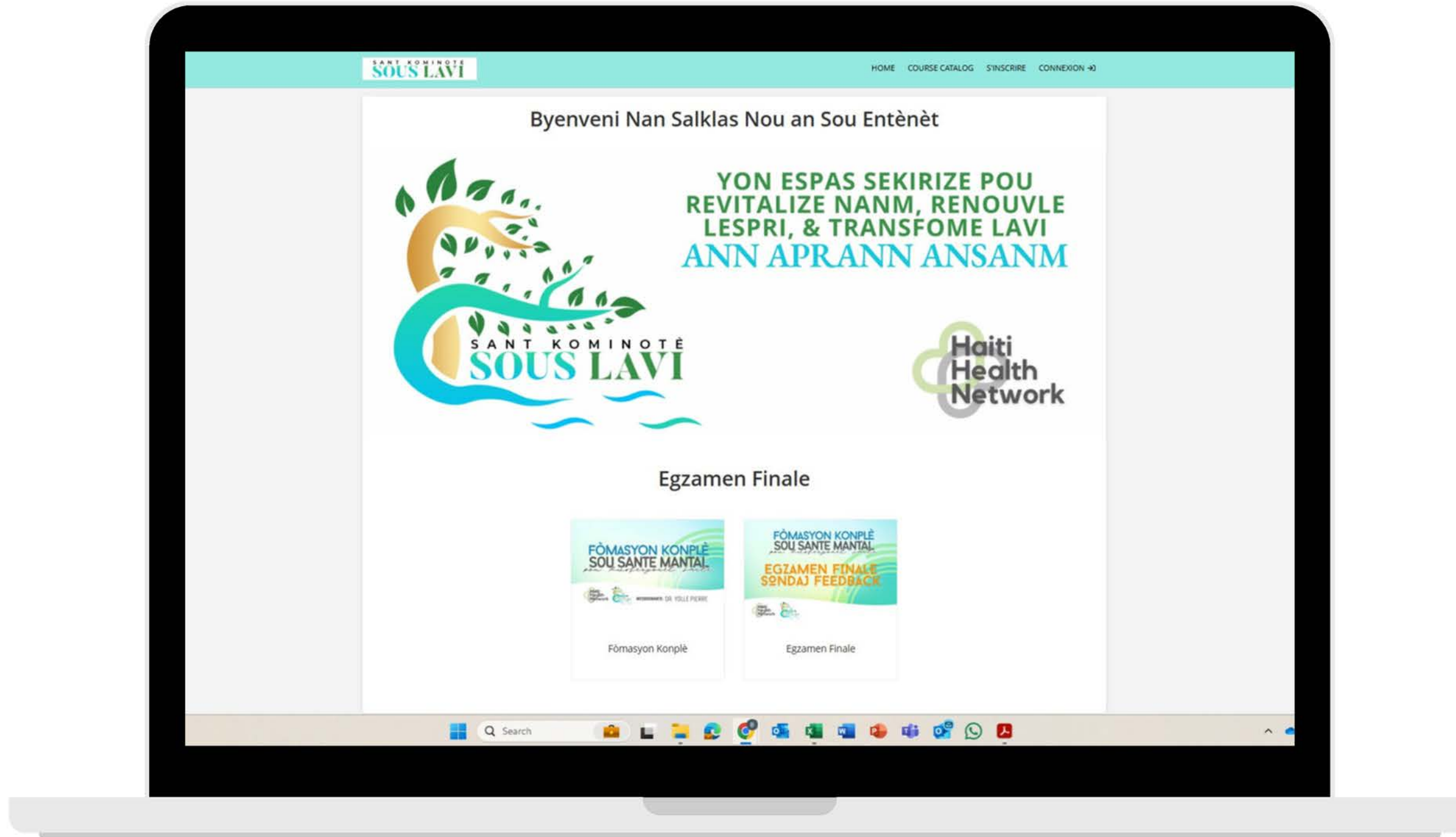

REFINING AND SCALING OUR RESPONSE

PSYCHOLOGICAL FIRST AID (PFA) IN HAITI

This initiative seeks to bridge that gap by building a network of community-based responders trained in PFA:

- Equipped to provide appropriate care and support in times of trauma
- Capable of providing psychological first aid in a crisis
- Ready to deploy in times of disaster

By equipping healthcare workers, community leaders such as pastors, church leaders, teachers, orphanage staff, and civil protection volunteers, with contextually adapted tools, we aim to strengthen Haiti's mental health response capacity, foster resilience, and lay the groundwork for long-term psychosocial recovery.

Target Geographic Areas: Nord-Ouest, Nord, Nord-Est, Centre and Ouest Departments.



REFINING AND SCALING OUR RESPONSE PSYCHOLOGICAL FIRST AID (PFA) IN HAITI

Core Components of “Preparing Haiti for Trauma Response” Initiative

1. Curriculum Development

- Development of a culturally relevant PFA training curriculum - Designed by Haitian Psychologist for Haitians
- Production of core training videos to allow facilitators to lead community training without risking the integrity of the training material

2. Training & Capacity Building

- Provision of training to 500 healthcare professionals across five departments
- Selection of 50 training attendees to become facilitators for future community trainings in five departments
- Provision of training to 1,100 community members across five departments
 - i. Targeting pastors or faith-based leaders, civil protection volunteers, local NGO or community organization staff, CHW's, midwives, etc.
- WhatsApp Community of Practices (CoP) created for facilitators, healthcare providers, community participants and deployable individuals to allow for ongoing learning opportunities, resource sharing, ongoing support and dialogue
- Creation of video-based eLearning course using the completed videos

3. Database of current mental health resources

- Current mental health resources available in each department will be listed on the Relink Global Health website
- Printed copies of the mental health resource data will be made available to healthcare practitioners and community members to assist with linking to further care when providing PFA

4. Evaluation of Training Impact: Immediate and Long-Term Retention

- Assessment of short term retention through pre- and post-training assessments
- Assessment of knowledge retention and applied knowledge through follow up survey 4-6 months post training
