

### 2014 to 2016, 2,387 cases, and 1,590 deaths.

2% of the population pushed below the extreme poverty line (2016)

37% faced increased financial strain due to health expenses


Only 3% of Liberians have health insurance

46% of healthcare costs paid directly by individuals

## **THE PROBLEM OF FINANCIAL ACCESS**

Lack of insurance coverage, especially in rural Liberia

**High out-of-pocket spending** among the poor



# OUR RESPONSE – SALT APPROACH

Participatory model known as the SALT approach, which stands for Stimulate / Support, Appreciate, Learn, and Transfer.

# **BIG BELLY CLUB MODEL**

The Big Belly Club was launched on August 18, 2021, as a community-based maternal health savings and loan program

Issuing loans to members with interest of 5% and payable in three months

Loans used to support birth preparations, cover medical cost and fund small-scale income generating activities

# **ACHIEVEMENTS**

**Financial Growth and service utilization**: The club loan portfolio grew from US\$100 to US\$2,150

### **Community advocacy and awareness**:

The club has strengthened maternal health advocacy within this community by making maternal and newborn care a community-wide concern rather than a women-only issue.





- **Improved maternal health outcomes**:
- 60% members pregnant delivered at this clinic using the loan to cover associated cost
  - Membership Expansion:
  - From 7 women to 100 active members including men and non pregnant women from 2021-2024

In summary, the Big Belly Club has effectively combined financial support, education, and community mobilization to improve maternal health outcomes and economic resilience. Its impact is both structural and personal, as it transforms not only systems but also the lives of individual mothers and families.
